Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Program:

The Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is pleased to launch the Postdoctoral Scholar <u>Domestic and Foreign Travel Funds Program</u>. This program provides matching funds for active UGA postdocs to present their current research at national and international academic conferences. Matching funds (at least 1:1) must be identified and may be provided by the postdoc's research mentor/supervisor, unit, or college, or by an external travel award or grant. The maximum funding from the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is \$1,500 per domestic trip or \$2,000 per international trip.

Applications will be reviewed in quarterly intervals, with deadlines on the second Tuesday of August, November, February, and May. The first deadline will be **August 10, 2021**.

SEC Emerging Scholars Program:

The Southeastern Conference Provosts have established an emerging scholars program to provide professional development and networking opportunities for current doctoral students and a limited number of postdoctoral researchers who are considering careers in higher education. The SEC Emerging Scholars Program is meant to encourage top scholars, with attention provided to those from historically underrepresented groups, to seek out employment and mentorship within the SEC. This virtual workshop will be held September 29 and 30, 2021 and will encourage top scholars, particularly those from historically underrepresented groups, to pursue careers at SEC member universities.

Scholars who participate in the career preparation workshop will be expected to attend the entire multi-day event, complete several pre-workshop assignments, and visit with representatives from all 14 SEC universities on a range of topics, including the hiring process.

A committee of UGA faculty members and administrators will select up to ten participants, three of whom may be postdoctoral researchers. UGA postdocs interested in attending the workshop should apply via UGA's InfoReady submission portal for the SEC Emerging Scholars Career Preparation Workshop _Postdocs internal competition by **August 6, 2021**.

Warren Alpert Distinguished Scholar Awards:

The Warren Alpert Distinguished Scholars program will support individual scientists of exceptional creativity in the field of basic or clinical neurosciences. These awards are given as a transitional post-doctoral award for recipients to enable their advance to a full-time faculty member at the Assistant Professor level or higher and/or to assist in the development of a laboratory program that would lead to independent funding. The medical school, research institute or academic hospital

appointing the scholar will be awarded \$200,000 annually for two years to cover their salary, lab costs, and related expenses.

UGA is invited to nominate one candidate and therefore will run a limited submission competition. To view full details of the competition and to apply be considered for UGA's nomination please see the competition on UGA's InfoReady Portal.

The UGA internal deadline is Friday, August 20, 2021.
