Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Program

The Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is pleased to launch the <u>Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Funds Program</u>. This program provides matching funds for active UGA postdocs to present their current research at national and international academic conferences. Matching funds (at least 1:1) must be identified and may be provided by the postdoc's research mentor/supervisor, unit, or college, or by an external travel award or grant. The maximum funding from the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is \$1,500 per domestic trip or \$2,000 per international trip.

Applications will be reviewed in quarterly intervals, with deadlines on the second

Tuesday of August, November, February, and May. **The next deadline will be November 8th, 2022.**

Postdoc Spotlight: Introducing our Postdocs



I am a postdoc in the Drake lab. I use mathematical models to try to understand how life history traits and ecological interactions shape the processes of infectious disease transmission. I received my Ph.D. in Mathematics from Purdue University in 2020. My

dissertation covered mathematical modeling of the transmission of mosquito-borne pathogens of wildlife. I am currently working on a project aiming to identify which traits make an animal species more likely to be a reservoir for zoonotic diseases.

I am a postdoc in Dr. CJ Tsai's lab, a forest functional genomics laboratory. I received my Ph.D. from West Virginia University in

2020 and my dissertation was on deciphering the genetics of sex-determination systems in willow and poplar trees. Here, I am trying to understand the function of repetitive DNAs in a hybrid poplar tree genome, as well as how the flowering time and the development of unisexual flowers could be regulated in plants with various approaches.
