## Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Program

The Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is pleased to launch the <u>Postdoctoral Scholar</u> <u>Domestic and Foreign Travel Funds Program</u>. This program provides matching funds for active UGA postdocs to present their current research at national and international academic conferences. Matching funds (at least 1:1) must be identified and may be provided by the postdoc's research mentor/supervisor, unit, or college, or by an external travel award or grant. The maximum funding from the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is \$1,500 per domestic trip or \$2,000 per international trip. Applications will be reviewed in quarterly intervals, with deadlines on the second Tuesday of August, November, February, and May. **The next deadline will be February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023**.

#### Sean Beckwith Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology

Sean Beckwith (he/him/his) is a postdoc with David Garfinkel in the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology interested in the dynamic genome, focusing on mechanisms used by mobile genetic elements for assembly and propagation. He received a Ph.D. from Stanford University in 2018 and a B.A. from Carleton College in

2012, and was awarded an NIH F32 postdoctoral fellowship in 2020. His doctoral work focused on the interplay between epigenetics and metabolic signaling. He currently

investigates the virus-like Ty1 retrotransposon in the budding yeast *Saccharomyces*. Sean's personal hobbies include cooking, travel, hiking, cycling, racquetball, ultimate frisbee, and disc golf. Email: <u>sean.beckwith@uga.edu</u>



#### Althea Moore Skidaway Institute of Oceanography

Althea is a postdoctoral researcher in Clifton Buck's lab working on a project examining the drought response of epiphytes in live oak forest canopies, including Spanish moss and resurrection ferns, and their influence on hydrological cycling and water chemistry. Althea also worked as a postdoctoral fellow at Emory University on a policy-

oriented project outlining research priorities to address and understand climate change across the state of Georgia. Althea received her Ph.D. from Northeastern University in the department of marine and environmental sciences. Her dissertation focused on the influence of environmental factors on species interactions in saltmarsh and mangrove ecosystems of Florida. She also has an M.S. in marine science from Virginia Institute of Marine Science at the College of William and Mary, where she studied seagrass ecosystems. Althea received her bachelor's degree in biology from Earlham College, where she focused on terrestrial ecology. Before she started grad school, Althea worked in a molecular biology lab at Brown University, studying the function of plant genes.
