Geared towards early-career faculty and postdocs, these 1-4-day trainings in omics, data science, climate, and professional development provide immediate take away skills for investigators from any institution and are offered in a variety of in-person, virtual, and hybrid formats.

Request for Information (RFI): Re-envisioning U.S. Postdoctoral Research Training and Career Progression within the Biomedical Research Enterprise (Deadline: April 14, 2023)

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) seeks information from extramural research community members regarding the current state of postdoctoral research training and career progression within the biomedical research enterprise. NIH is particularly interested in understanding the perspective and experience of recent and current postdoctoral trainees, postdoctoral office leaders, as well as graduate students considering becoming postdoctoral trainees within the academic sector. This RFI will assist NIH in hearing the voices of postdoctoral trainees along with others impacted by this unique and skilled training position, and in exploring ways to address some of the fundamental challenges faced by the postdoctoral trainee community. This information will inform the development of recommendations by the NIH Advisory Committee to the Director (ACD), an advisory group that provides advice on matters pertinent to NIH mission responsibilities in the conduct and support of biomedical research, medical science, and biomedical communications.

Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Program

The Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is pleased to launch the <u>Postdoctoral Scholar</u> <u>Domestic and Foreign Travel Funds Program</u>. This program provides matching funds

for active UGA postdocs to present their current research at national and international academic conferences. Matching funds (at least 1:1) must be identified and may be provided by the postdoc's research mentor/supervisor, unit, or college, or by an external travel award or grant. The maximum funding from the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is \$1,500 per domestic trip or \$2,000 per international trip.

Applications will be reviewed in quarterly intervals, with deadlines on the second Tuesday of August, November, February, and May. **The next deadline will be May 9th, 2023.**

Heather F Lavender NSF Postdoctoral Research Fellow Department of Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies Education in the Mary Frances Early College of Education

I received a Postdoctoral grant (<u>The Young Black Girl: Influencing Science Interest and Commitment to STEM through the Merging of Lived Experiences of Learning in an Out-of-School Program</u>) from the National Science Foundation this year to start my postdoctoral

fellowship and selected Mary Atwater as a Sponsoring Researcher and UGA as a host institution. I am overjoyed to be one of two in the entire state of Georgia to carry such a grant and excited to do the work. My research "stems" from the recommendations that I put forth in my dissertation (The Young Black Girl: A Narration of STEM Identity through Science Origin in Elementary School), completed at Louisiana State University in December 2021. My current work focuses on the science experience, exposure, and identity of young Black girls. Overall, I hope to lead my research to encompass the K-5 girl as I am passionate regarding equity for women and girls in STEM and STEM careers. Prior to UGA, I worked as an Education and Outreach Coordinator at LSU, after several years as Research Associate in Microbiology in many states. I am originally from Louisiana. When I'm not working, I enjoy hiking, time with friends, thoroughly missing Louisiana during Mardi Gras, joining my husband as the personal schedulers to our two boys, and time with my beloved Goldendoodle Beignet. Michelle Pena MacLellan Postdoctoral Research Associate Department of Plant Pathology

Dr. Pena received a M.S. in Agronomy – Genetics and Plant Breeding and a Ph.D. in Agricultural and Livestock Microbiology from the São Paulo State University – Brazil. During her M.S she used barcode approach to find molecular markers (mitochondrial, chloroplastidial and/or nuclear genes) for plants discrimination. For

her Ph.D. she focused on the study of citrus-*Xanthomonas* interactions, working on the functional analysis of hypothetical proteins from *Xanthomonas citri* spp. *citri* responsible for bacterial virulence and pathogenicity. Dr. Pena has served as Postdoctoral Fellow at Auburn University where she worked with pathogenic and nonpathogenic bacteria investigating their diversity, mechanisms of interaction and how we can explore the evolutionary dynamic and the potential influence of these plant-associated microbes on the overall plant health. In her new position as Postdoctoral Research Associate under Dr. Dutta's vegetable extension program she will work on pathogenic bacterial

(Xanthomonas spp., Pseudomonas spp., Burkholderia spp.) of diverse vegetable crops (onion, cucurbits, pepper, and tomato), investigating their virulence mechanisms, potential survival and seed-to-seedling transmission, integrated disease

management and seed treatments to reduce bacterial survival and seedling transmission.
