Request for Information (RFI): Re-envisioning U.S. Postdoctoral Research Training and Career Progression within the Biomedical Research Enterprise (Deadline: April 14, 2023)

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) seeks information from extramural research community members regarding the current state of postdoctoral research training and career progression within the biomedical research enterprise. NIH is particularly interested in understanding the perspective and experience of recent and current postdoctoral trainees, postdoctoral office leaders, as well as graduate students considering becoming postdoctoral trainees within the academic sector. This RFI will assist NIH in hearing the voices of postdoctoral trainees along with others impacted by this unique and skilled training position, and in exploring ways to address some of the fundamental challenges faced by the postdoctoral trainee community. This information will inform the development of recommendations by the NIH Advisory Committee to the Director (ACD), an advisory group that provides advice on matters pertinent to NIH mission responsibilities in the conduct and support of biomedical research, medical science, and biomedical communications.

Southeastern Conference (SEC) Emerging Scholars Program – FY24 UGA competition announcement (Application deadline: May 1, 2023)

The Southeastern Conference (SEC) Emerging Scholars Program is a year-long professional development series preparing diverse scholars from member institutions to enter academia. Selected scholars will participate in an inter-institutional SEC Emerging Scholars Career Preparation workshop in the Fall of 2023. The 2023 Emerging Scholars Workshop will be hosted by the University of Arkansas. The dates for the workshop will be Sunday, October 1 (travel day) through Wednesday morning, October 4, 2023.

All active UGA postdocs seeking an academic faculty position are eligible to apply. Postdocs must remain as a UGA postdoc through the academic year to receive full benefit and compensation for the program. Please find attached for the details.

Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Program (Deadline: May 9, 2023)

The Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is pleased to launch the <u>Postdoctoral Scholar Domestic and Foreign Travel Funds Program</u>. This program provides matching funds for active UGA postdocs to present their current research at national and international academic conferences. Matching funds (at least 1:1) must be identified and may be provided by the postdoc's research mentor/supervisor, unit, or college, or by an external travel award or grant. The maximum funding from the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs is \$1,500 per domestic trip or \$2,000 per international trip.

Applications will be reviewed in quarterly intervals, with deadlines on the second Tuesday of August, November, February, and May. **The next deadline will be May 9th, 2023**.

Mahdi Morad Pour

Department of Genetics and Department of Plant Biology at the Warnell School of Forestry and Natural Resources

Mahdi Morad Pour (he/him/his) is a Postdoc with Dr. Chung-Jui Tsai. His research interest centers in the forest functional genomics and genome editing for climate change. He received his Ph.D. in Genetic Engineering and Molecular Biology from University of Putra Malaysia in 2021. His doctoral work focused on the regulation of

temperature stress-responsive transcriptional regulatory network by CRISPR/dCas9 in plants. Mahdi completed his first post-doctorate research scientist appointment in Bioinformatics at Tallinn University of Technology in Estonia in collaboration projects with Helsinki University of Finland. Dr. Mahdi's postdoctoral work focused on Bioinformatics approaches to study potential regulators of wood formation in trees. Meanwhile, he served as a member of two different actions of European Cooperation in Science and Technology in the European Union.
